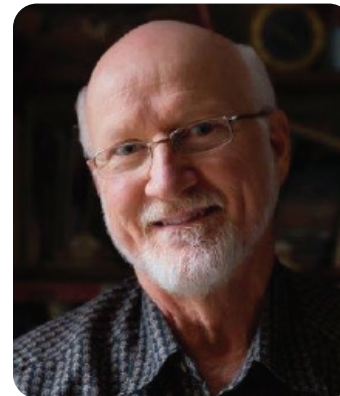

## MAUNDY THURSDAY

The last Thursday of this month is what is known as “Maundy Thursday.” It is intended to be a recognition of the Last Supper when Jesus celebrated the Passover for the last time with his disciples. The name “Maundy” comes from the Latin word “mandatum,” which means command, as Jesus commanded his disciples to love and serve one another. It may also have derived from the Middle English word “maund” which was a collection bag for the poor. Historically, part of keeping Maundy Thursday meant collecting money for the poor. Most Southern Baptists did not grow up keeping or even hearing about “Maundy Thursday.” I certainly did not. This is a special time of the year when we focus our hearts and minds on the greatest event in history—the culmination of everything God’s Chosen People, Israel, were being prepared for, the coming of their Messiah. Only He did not come in the way most of the Jewish religious leaders expected. He came not to give deliverance from governmental bondage and oppression, but to deliver mankind from the bondage of sin and its eternal consequence. Still today, the revived nation of Jewish Israel is seeking deliverance from man’s oppression against them. Antisemitism is on the rise as we remember the Holocaust and say, “never again!” But our prayer must be that

all Jews and all of lost humanity would find true deliverance from evil that can only begin with a total recognition of and relationship with the Messiah, the Lord Jesus Christ, Yahusha H’amshiach.
